And he said, The God of our fathers has chosen thee, that thou should know His will, Acts 22:14.

Jesus did not question the Father's will.

My Father, if this cup cannot pass away, Matthew 26:39. Father, not what I will, but what You will, Mark 14:36. Father, not My will, but Yours be done, Luke 22:42.

This plea is not in John's gospel account, but rather; My soul troubled; what shall I say? Father, save Me from this hour: but for this cause came I unto this hour, John 12:27.

Jesus told His disciples at-least four times that He was to be crucified in Jerusalem, He also told them:

I and My Father are one, John 10:30.

We also need to know the Father's will.

be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what *is* that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God, Romans 12:2.

That he no longer should live the rest of *his* time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God, 1st Peter 4:2.

ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise, Hebrews 10:36.
