Teaching: "Look Up!"

Strong's NT:308: "anablepö" definition; to look up; by implication to recover sight: - look (up), see, receive sight.

Feeding of the 5,000 – Matthew 14:19, Mark 6:41, Luke 9:16.

Jesus took the five loaves, and the two fishes, and <u>looking up</u> to heaven, He blessed, and brake, and gave the loaves to *His* disciples, and the disciples to the multitude, <u>Matthew 14:19</u>.

O.T. - looking up at the serpent on a pole.

And the LORD said to Moses, Make thee a fiery serpent, and set it upon a pole: and it shall come to pass, that every one that is bitten, when he looks upon it, shall live, Numbers 21:8.

N.T. - fulfillment.

And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even <u>so must</u> <u>the Son of man be lifted up</u>: That whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life, John 3:14-16.

Other examples of looking up.

My voice shall Thou hear in the morning, O LORD; I will direct *my prayer* unto Thee, and will <u>look up</u>, Psalms 5:3.

Then they took away the stone *from the place* where the dead was laid. And <u>Jesus lifted up *His* eyes</u>, and said, Father, I thank Thee that Thou has heard Me, John 11:41.

And when these things begin to come to pass, then <u>look up</u>, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draws nigh, Luke 21:28.
