## Teaching: "The Father's love and other such things"

## The best way to understand God's love is:

Love suffers long, *and* is kind; love envies not; love vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up,

Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeks not its own, is not provoked, takes not account of evil;

Rejoices not in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth; Bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never fails: but whether *there be* prophecies, they shall be done away; whether *there be* tongues, they shall cease; whether *there be* knowledge, it shall be done away, 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 4-8.

## Jesus and the Father are One, and they both love us.

He that has seen Me (*Jesus*) has seen the Father, John 14:9.

Even as the Father has loved Me, I also have loved you: abide ye in My love, John 15:9.

God is love, 1st John 4:8.

Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us, and sent His Son *to be* the propitiation for our sins, 1<sup>st</sup> John 4:10.

And we know and have believed the love which God has in us. God is love; and he that abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him, 1<sup>st</sup> John 4:16.

## Our brains were made and wired for love:

God has not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind, 2<sup>nd</sup> Timothy 1:7.

For, we are made in the image and the likeness of God, Genesis 1:26-27.
