Teaching: "The Power of Forgiveness"

Judge not, and ye shall not be judged: condemn not, and ye shall not be condemned: *forgive*, *and ye shall be forgiven*: Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. *For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again*, Luke 6:37-8.

What forgiveness is:

- is primarily for the sake of the person asking for it.
- Releases you from carrying around your bitterness, (your "rightful-wrong"), about the situation, allowing you to then dwell in peace, (the finished work of Christ).

What forgiveness is not:

- it is not a "get out of jail free card" for the offender.
- it does not turn you into a walking doormat.

How to achieve forgiveness:

- God is the Forgiver.
 Who can forgive sins, but God alone, Luke 5:21, Mark 2:7.
- Three possible areas to ask for forgiveness:
 - Vertically, ask the Lord to forgive you even if you are unsure of the nature of the offence.
 - 2. Inwardly, forgive yourself the only perfect Man we crucified 2,000 years ago.
 - 3. If God impresses it on your heart, ask your offender for forgiveness.

Once we forgive, we are able to enjoy His peace

Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you: not as the world gives, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid, John 14:27.

Forgiveness: it's a kingdom requirement.

- If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness, 1st John 1:9.
- Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as
 we forgive our debtors.... If ye forgive men their
 trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you:
 But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your
 Father forgive your trespasses, Matthew 6:11-12, 14-15.
- Blessed are they whose iniquities are forgiven, and whose sins are covered, Romans 4:7.
- In whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace; Ephesians 1:7.
- And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, has He quickened together with Him, having forgiven you all trespasses; Colossians 2:13.
