The Apostles Paul's Trial and tribulations.

²⁴ Of the Jews five times received I forty stripes save one. ²⁵ Thrice was I beaten with rods, once was I stoned, thrice I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I have been in the deep; ²⁶ In journeying often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils by mine own countrymen, in perils by the heathen, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils among false brethren; ²⁷ In weariness and painfulness, in watching often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness. ²⁸ Beside those things that are without, that which cometh upon me daily, the care of all the churches, 2nd Corinthians 11:24-28.

Apostle Paul's trials recorded in the book of Acts:

- 1. In Damascus, immediately, after his conversion, he preached the word boldly, the Jews plotted to kill him and he escaped the city. Acts 9:20-25.
- 2. In Jerusalem, he spoke boldly and disputed against the Hellenists and they attempted to kill him. When the apostles found out, they brought him to Caesarea and sent him to Tarsus. Acts 9:28-30.
- 3. In Antioch of Pisidia, Paul taught, but the Jews raised up persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their region, and they came into Iconium. Acts 13:48-51.
- 4. In Iconium, a violent attempt was made by both Jews and Gentiles to abuse and stone them, they fled to Lystra. Acts 14:5-6.
- 5. In Lystra, Jews from Antioch persuaded the people to stone Paul and they left him for dead. The disciples gathered around him and he rose up, the next day he departed with Barnabas for Derbe, Acts 19-20.
- 6. In Philippi, Paul and Silas were beaten openly and thrown into prison, the next day to be released and departed from the city. Acts 16:19-40.
- 7. In Thessalonica, Unbelieving Jews stirred up the city, attempted to seize Paul & Silas but when they could not be found they took the homeowner, Paul & Silas went away by night to Berea. Acts 17:5-10.
- 8. In Berea, The Unbelieving Jews from Thessalonica and stirred up the crowds. Immediately, the brethren sent Paul away by sea and he came unto Athens. Acts 17:13-14.
- 9. And when he had come into Greece, after 3 months the Jews plotted against him, Paul changed his travel plans, to backtrack through Macedonia. Acts 20:3.
- 10. In Jerusalem, When Paul's seven day purification was almost complete, the Jews from Asia, came to Jerusalem, pull Paul out of the temple and began to beat him. Acts 21:27.
- 11. In Caesarea, Paul was taken under guard to be judged by governor Felix. The Jews from Asia stirred up the High priest and the elders in Jerusalem and went to Caesarea, to testify against him. Acts 24:1.
- 12. Shipwrecked in the Adriatic sea, being taken as a prisoner to Rome, Paul and crew flee the ship and find shelter on the isle of Melita. Acts 24:1.
- 13. On the isle of Melita, Paul gets bitten by a viper and bit him. Paul shook it off and suffered no harm, Acts 28:3-5.
