

Teaching: “Jesus is the true Light”

In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.

different Hebrew words translated as light,
Jesus, the Word is our true Light.

- ♦ **ówr (ore); # OT:216 Genesis 1:3**, derived from OT:215;
illumination or (concrete) luminary (in every sense, including lightning, happiness, etc.):
KJV - bright, clear, + day, light (-ning), morning, sun.
- ♦ **ma'owr (maw-ore'); # OT:3974 Genesis 1:14,15**,
also (in plural) feminine me'owrah (meh-o-raw'); or meorah (meh-o-raw'); from OT:215; properly, a luminous body or luminary, i.e. (abstractly) light (as an element): figuratively, brightness, i.e. cheerfulness; specifically, a chandelier:
KJV - bright, light.
- ♦ **ówr (ore); # OT:215 a primitive root**;
to be (causative, make) luminous (literally and metaphorically):
KJV - X break of day, glorious, kindle, (be, en-, give, show) light (-en, -ened), set on fire, shine.
